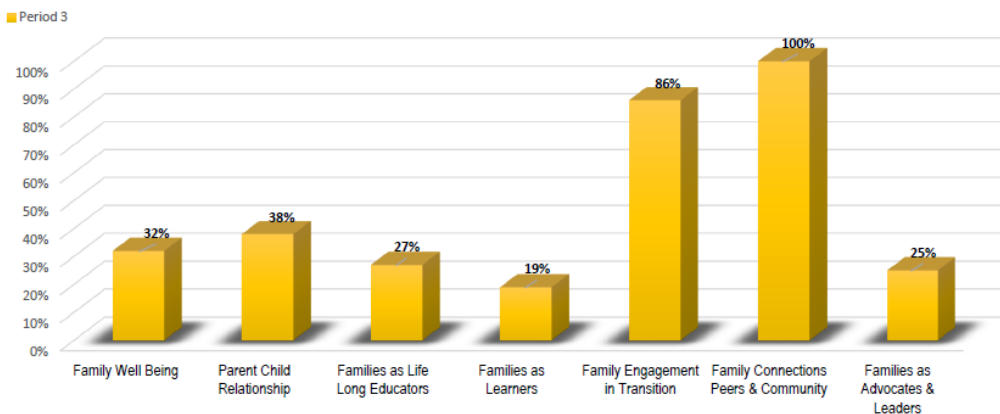

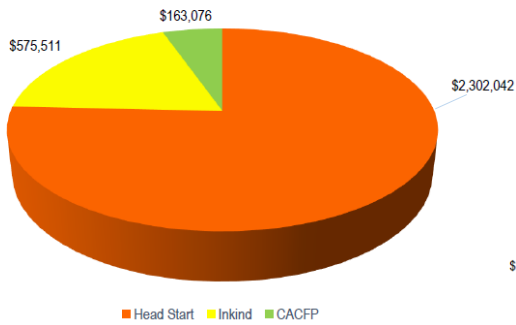
Program Description

Head Start provides a quality pre-k program for three and four year old children. 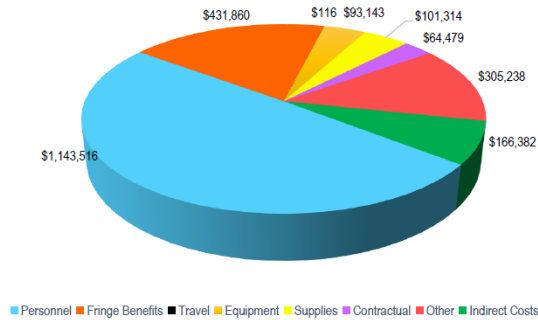

Audit & Review Statement

Staffing—To ensure comprehensive quality programming each center has the following staff:

- ✓ Teacher with a degree in Early Education, Teaching Assistant, Family Specialist, Cook, Nurse, Classroom Aide & Substitutes

Administrative Staff responsible for oversight include:

Children We Serve

The Oswego County Head Start program was federally funded to serve 239 children in Oswego County for 2015-16. Funded enrollment was reduced to 222 effective July 2016. The program operated seven center-based programs and one home based option.

The program options include:

Eight half-day session (3 ½ hour class AM/PM) 4 days per week:

Oswego and 3 Fulton programs: Fairgrieve, Fulton & Pinewoods

Three part-day (4 hour class) 5 days per week:

Cleveland (now known as North Shore), Phoenix & Williamstown

Three full-day (6 hour class) 5 days per week:

Oswego & Phoenix

One home base option (1 ½ hours in home weekly visits and bi-monthly class):

Mexico

- A total of 291 children were served.
- There were 275 families, of which 42% were two-parent families.
- 94% of the enrolled children were 100% eligible and 6% of the children enrolled were from families with income higher than 100% federal poverty level.
- 26% of enrolled children were identified as having a disability.

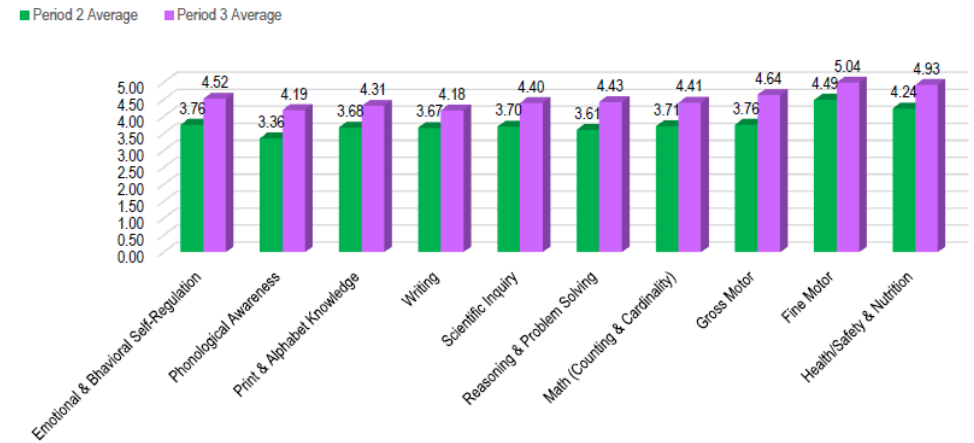
