## WHAT'S NEW AT OCO?



# **Expanding Educational and Employment Opportunities**

OCO, in partnership with CiTi's Lifelong Learning Center, has established Literacy Zones in Fulton and Pulaski to address the challenges faced by individuals with limited literacy or English proficiency. Funded by the NY State Education Department, these zones aim to close the achievement gap in areas with high poverty rates.

The Literacy Zones provide crucial services. These initiatives offer a systemic approach to meeting the literacy needs of the community, from youth to adults, and provide essential support for educational and career advancement.





#### **Rapid Hep-C Testing**

In response to rising Hepatitis C cases, OCO Centers for Reproductive Health have implemented rapid Hepatitis C testing, becoming the first in Oswego County to offer this service. This initiative aligns with the new New York State mandate requiring Hepatitis C testing for all adults 18 and older, and at-risk individuals under 18.

The rapid testing allows for results within minutes, enabling prompt referrals for treatment and preventing serious complications like cirrhosis and liver failure. This expansion complements OCO's existing rapid STI testing services (HIV and syphilis), reinforcing its commitment to comprehensive reproductive health care and confidential, compassionate patient service.

#### **OCO Partners with Fulton & Oswego Police**

OCO's Health Homes partnered with the Fulton & Oswego Police Departments to address the growing issue of mental health and substance use disorder in Oswego County. By embedding a case manager within the police departments, OCO aims to provide immediate access to vital services and support for individuals in crisis. This collaboration, funded by a NY State Office of Mental Health grant, enhances the program's reach and enables police officers to connect individuals directly with care coordination, treatment options, and essential resources like housing and financial assistance. This initiative not only improves the well-being of those served but also reduces strain on emergency services and fosters a healthier community





#### **OCO Head Start Shares Their Expertise**

OCO's Early Childhood Education program staff presented a workshop at Head Start Region II Conference in St. Thomas VI. Their presentation on Building Relationships with Children and Families provided participants with resources and various approaches to successfully engaging with children and families. They were asked to share many materials that we use here at OCO Head Start and present in neighboring counties.

## **Hope and Healing**

As Ashley Gardner was doing her daily breast self-exam she noticed a rather prominent lump that seemed to develop quickly. She knew she would need medical assistance but with no health insurance she didn't know where to turn to . "I don't know where I'd be today if not for the help I received from Christina and everyone at the Cancer Services Program," said Gardner. The program really is a life-saver. If not for Christina's knowledge and support I would not have been able to receive the medical treatment I needed. I would have been lost without her. Even now that I am cancer free Christina and the Cancer Services Program is still there for me. They are quick to answer any questions and I have ensured that I will have financial assistance for the ongoing treatments I will be having in 2025." "I encourage women to learn more about OCO's Cancer Services Program of the North Country and discover the knowledge and support its caring and compassionate staff can provide. It was comforting to know my family and I did not have to go through this alone, and the financial assistance they found made it possible for me to receive the medical treatment I needed."



## **A New Beginning**

I don't remember how I got there, just that I was sitting on a bench outside some office building. Lost. Confused. I didn't even know how long I'd been living on the streets. It all blurred together. I felt like a mess. Then, someone from OCO found me. They didn't judge. They just... helped. A warm meal, a hot shower – things I hadn't had in what felt like forever. They even helped me wash my clothes. They talked to me, not at me, and helped me make a plan, a safety plan. I hadn't thought about safety in a long time. They found me a place to stay for the weekend, too. A real bed. Monday came, and they were there again. They helped me access services that allowed me to stay in a hotel for a bit. That's when I finally got some help, a mental health evaluation. It was scary, but it was also the first step toward feeling less lost. From the hotel, I was able to move into a local shelter. It was a place to start. OCO stayed with me through it all. They helped me find a job – I never thought I'd be able to work again. They guided me through finding an apartment. Now... well, now I have my own place. I can actually talk to people without feeling like everyone's staring at me. It's hard to believe, sometimes. It's been a long, hard road since that first day sitting on what I thought was a random bench but turned out to be exactly where I needed to be at that moment. I'm grateful for OCO for giving me a chance to find my way back to myself. I'm living proof that even when you're completely lost, hope is still possible.

## **EVENTS**



We are deeply grateful for the ongoing support of our volunteers, employees, donors, and partners, whose contributions make these life-changing services possible.





From 2019 to 2024 -

2024 Expense Composition







#### 2024 MARKS 60TH ANNIVERSARY OF COMMUNITY ACTION

President Johnson declared an "unconditional war on poverty" in his January 1964 State of the Union address, leading to the August 1964 signing of the Economic Opportunity Act (EOA). This landmark legislation launched numerous social programs to combat poverty through education, health, employment, and welfare initiatives. In 2024, the 60th anniversary of these efforts was marked by state-wide and local commemorations by New York State Community Action Association (NYSCAA) and New York's Community Action Agencies (CAAs), including Oswego County Opportunities, Inc. (OCO). OCO, established in March 1966 as a direct result of the EOA, continues to pursue the goal of "eliminating the paradox of poverty in the midst of plenty."
