

Standards for Passenger Behavior

To ensure the safety and comfort of all passengers, the following are not allowed:

Illegal or Dangerous Behavior:

- Any illegal activity, including assault, threats, fighting, theft, vandalism, or indecent exposure.
- Possessing or using alcohol, illegal drugs, illegal weapons, or dangerous items.
- Throwing objects or engaging in hazardous activities (e.g., skateboards, hoverboards).

Failure to Comply

- Fare evasion, forged fare, or refusal to pay.
- Ignoring instructions from transit staff or posted signs.
- Violating a current suspension notice.

Disruptive or Unsafe Conduct

- Harassment, verbal disputes, excessive profanity, or unreasonable noise.
- Sleeping when disruptive or unsafe.
- Spitting, littering, or public urination/defecation.
- Playing loud music without headphones.

Food, Smoking & Substances

- Smoking, vaping, or chewing tobacco on property.
- Eating or carrying open food or beverage containers.

Obstruction & Safety Issues

- Blocking aisles or bus traffic lanes.
- Standing ahead of the yellow standee line.
- Occupying more than one seat unnecessarily.
- Extending body parts outside windows.
- Leaving children in strollers when boarding; strollers and carts must be folded.

Unauthorized Items or Activities

- Unauthorized animals (service animals permitted).
- Soliciting funds or conducting commercial activity.
- Loitering or trespassing.

Enforcement

Note: Violators may be suspended from using transit transportation and facilities.

In accordance with State Law, the following activities will be enforced by local authorities:

- Engaging in illegal activities
- Fighting or threats of violence
- Failure to leave the bus after being directed to do so
- Willfully destroying or damaging Oswego County Opportunities or Oswego County Property
